Park Name	Location	Clue to Number of Eggs
<b>Community Park</b>	Ryan Dr. and Ann Arbor Rd.	Though the scramble has been cancelled at Community Park, Hidden all around are eggs counting three. During the morning, afternoon, or just before dark, Take a pic with them all and be sure to say "cheese."

<b>Mill Creek Park</b>	Main St./Alpine St./Jeffords St.	What once was called Warrior Creek Park has a new name Mill Creek Park North is now where you go to have fun A secret I will share there are six eggs to claim Make sure you play on the swings along the water run
<b>Monument Park</b>	Main St. and Central St.	A monument stands proud and tall So that their sacrifice we will recall But before you leave make sure to find The six eggs we left behind
<b>Peace Park</b>	Inverness and Dexter-Ann Arbor Rd.	Though Peace Park be but mini, its mission is grand: We'll get through this together, walking hand in hand. For now, keep your distance and say, "How do you do?," As you search for the eggs, their number is two.
<b>Mill Creek Trail</b>	Between Mill Creek Park and Creekside Intermediate School	Along the banks of the Mill Creek and the brand-new trail A startled deer you may see raising its tail. This is a non-motorized path, so please do not drive As you search for the eggs, a total of five.
